Citations and Figures (used every time you reference a source in the body of your work)

Ted doesn't know whether to use 'small talk or big talk' (Dowd, 2007, p. 32) which further emphasises not only the difficulty he finds in his current situation, but in his everyday life.

Dowd (2007) emphasises the importance of precision and ritual in Ted's everyday activities (pp. 23-24) in a way that would not be possible from an alternative first person perspective.

Keaton's later career roles maintained a level of self-awareness around his position in silent cinema, and as shown in fig. 1. were far more likely to be concerned with the subject of film.

Bibliography Formatting Rules

- Place the list of works cited at the end of the paper.
- Centre the title, "Works Cited", one inch from the top of the page.
- Double space between the title and the first entry.
- Double space both within and between entries.
- Begin each entry flush with the left margin.
- Indent subsequent lines one-half inch (five spaces).
- Alphabetised by the author's (or editor's) last name.
- Entries without an author are alphabetized by title

References (a list of *all* the sources you consulted while writing your paper)
